The Carpinteria Salt Marsh Restoration Story

The 230-acre Carpinteria Salt Marsh is one of the few remaining coastal wetlands in California. Once much more extensive, today the remaining habitats of the Carpinteria Salt Marsh are surrounded by the city of Carpinteria. Over 25 years ago, the natural habitats of the marsh had been proposed for residential and marina development. Today, it is a scenic and ecological focal point along this stretch of the Santa Barbara County coast.

In fall 2004, the Land Trust for Santa Barbara County (Land Trust) began a large-scale restoration project on its 36-acre property within the Carpinteria Salt Marsh. The Land Trust's Basin 1 and South Marsh restoration project builds upon many years of collaborative conservation among the University of California, Land Trust, City of Carpinteria, Santa Barbara County Flood Control District, Southern California Wetland Recovery Project, local homeowners, and other community-based groups, as well as numerous State and Federal resource agencies.
